The team at Rocky Mountain Youth Clinics (RMYC) is deeply committed to the mission of offering affordable, accessible, high quality health care services to youth, regardless of their family's insurance status or ability to pay. 2015 was another very successful year for us! In partnership with school districts and other community partners around the state, we opened new school-based health clinics in high need communities at Aurora Central and Carbondale High Schools and a new partnership was formed with the school-based clinic at Southwest Open School in Cortez. Through these new clinics, strong community partnerships, and a growing and dedicated team that works across all 12 RMYC sites, we provided comprehensive medical, behavioral, dental, nutrition and other supportive services to nearly 23,000 patients. Additionally, we piloted new and innovative approaches to make care more convenient and to ensure that kids get timely supports, such as connecting a child psychiatrist with our clinicians through tele-behavioral health software. I'm very proud of the RMYC team and we want to thank all of our supporters for helping us carry out our mission!

### INTEGRATED BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

RMYC provides comprehensive behavioral health screenings for all patients and treatment for children according to need. RMYC also offers treatment and education to new mothers who may be experiencing pregnancy-related depression and patients diagnosed with attention deficit/hyperactivity disorder.



### EDNA'S FOOD PANTRY

Thrive Clinic patients and families who are challenged with food insecurity receive emergency and supplemental food from Edna's Food Pantry. Families receive sufficient nutritious, wholesome food to feed a family of four for a full week.



### INTEGRATED DENTAL CARE

RMYC identifies oral care needs, provides necessary treatment, refers patients for additional needed services, and serves as a dental home for patients to ensure ongoing care.



### GET FIT CLINIC

Get Fit helps children and teens with medical, psychological, and nutritional issues related to living a healthy lifestyle. The clinic serves kids with a Body Mass Index greater than or equal to 85% who want help learning how to live a healthier lifestyle.



### SCHOOL BASED HEALTH CLINICS

SBHCs provide on-site health services to students who do not have a medical home or are in need of health services in a convenient setting.



### ASTHMA PROGRAM

Asthma Program provides education and treatment for patients diagnosed with asthma, including how to properly use asthma medicine, nebulizers, and inhalers.



### HEALTH CARE MOBILES

Care Mobiles travel to schools and community sites to offer medical and dental health care services to children in low-income neighborhoods.



### CARE NAVIGATION

Care Navigators coordinate specialty medical care, help families apply for benefits, and connect families with community resources for housing, transportation, clothing, food, education, and other support.



### THRIVE CLINIC

Thrive Clinic supports patients who are experiencing slow or minimal growth due to food insecurity and/or medical conditions. A pediatrician, dietician, and resource coordinator help Thrive patients and their families evaluate medical needs, create a treatment plan, learn about nutrition, and access community resources.



### READING FOR THE HEALTH OF IT

RMYC and Reach Out and Read give free books to patients during appointments to encourage reading. RMYC also offers backpacks and school supplies for children in need through its annual Kids Rock: Back to School Campaign.
