Our Story in 2023

HIGHLIGHTS

In 2023, Every Child Pediatrics built meaningful momentum toward our long-term goals of expanding access to care, strengthening community partnerships, and advancing health equity. This year, we made critical strides in program development, volunteer engagement, and workforce growth, laying a strong foundation for the future.

- **Advancing DEI:** Launched a 2-year DEI Grant with 73% staff participation in a live survey, resulting in a comprehensive report to guide the next 3–5 years.
- **Trauma-Informed Care:** Embedded trauma-informed principles into training, planning, and staff “Pulse Checks,” with expanded supervisor and secondary trauma training slated for 2024.
- **Behavioral Health Growth:** Served 3,510 children through 6,763 behavioral health encounters, aligned with our 3-year staffing plan.
- **Workforce Development:** Established hands-on training programs for medical assistants and behavioral health trainees, along with a preceptor program to grow future leaders in health equity.

OUR MISSION

Every Child Pediatrics provides comprehensive health care to every child, regardless of their insurance status or ability to pay. We provide a Medical Home for children with complex life situations, and offer services to support their entire health and well being. We see a high number of uninsured children, as well as children enrolled in Medicaid. We never turn a child away.

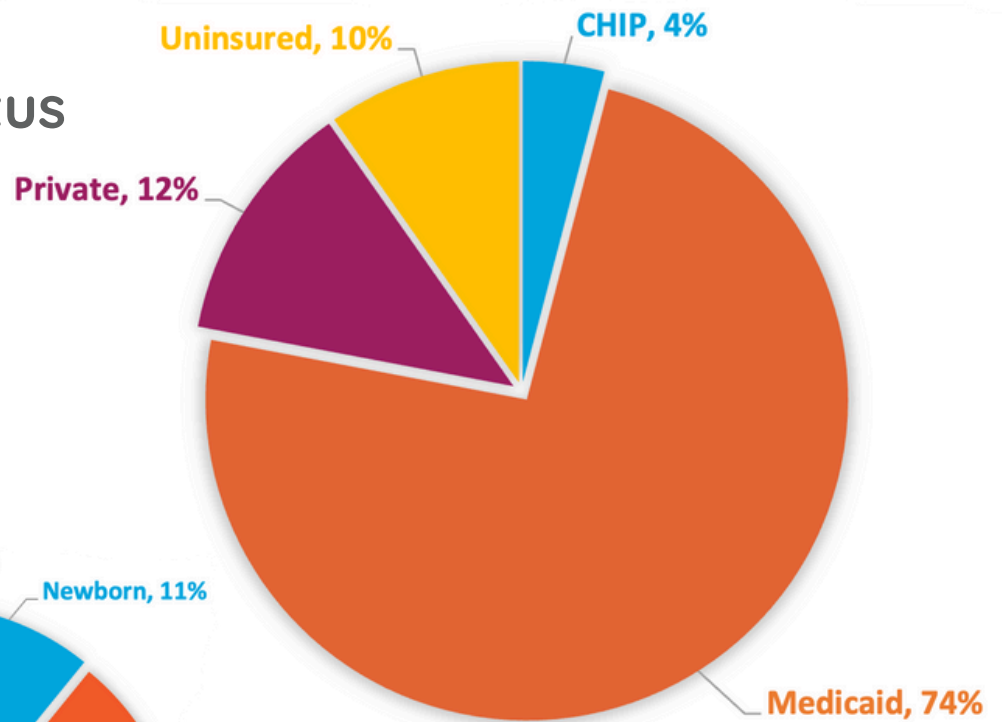

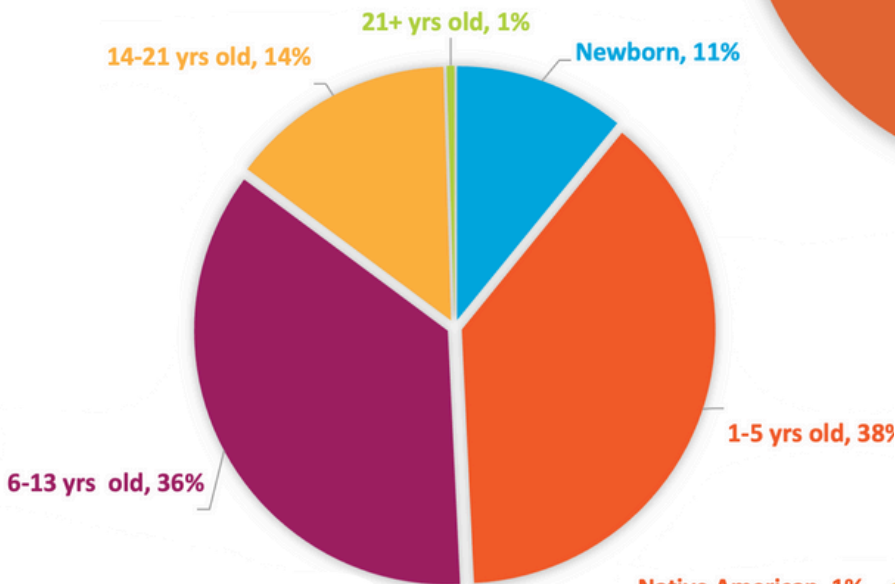

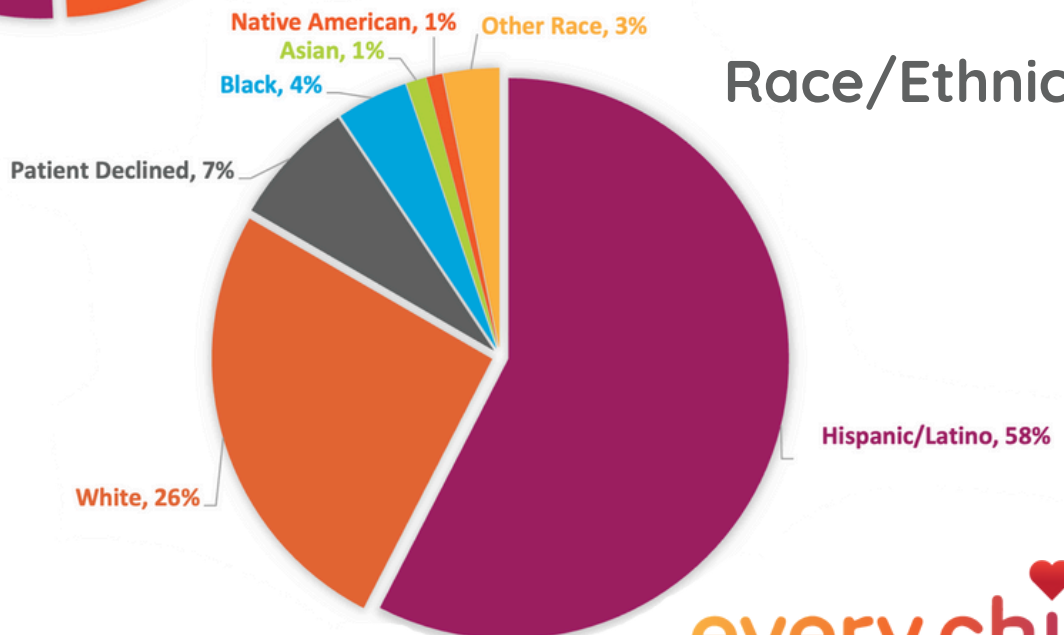
Insurance Status

Message from Executive Director

As I reflect on 2023, I am deeply grateful for our dedicated staff and the strong partnerships that make our mission possible. At Every Child Pediatrics, we remain committed to providing quality, integrated care to every child—care that goes beyond physical health to include behavioral, emotional, and social well-being.

This year we made meaningful strides: 73% of our staff participated in a DEI initiative that produced a roadmap for the next 3–5 years, and our Trauma-Informed Care program reshaped how we train and support staff. Our Behavioral Health program, strengthened by a long-term staffing plan, served more than 3,500 children through nearly 7,000 encounters. With the help of over 500 volunteers, we also provided vital family support—delivering backpacks, Thanksgiving baskets, and holiday assistance to dozens of families.

Still, challenges remain. The demand for services continues to exceed supply, and we face ongoing workforce shortages and systemic changes in healthcare. Yet our three-year vision is bold: expanding community partnerships, launching new donor initiatives, opening two school-based health centers in Fort Collins, and expanding services at the Samaritan House Shelter to reach 800 new patients.

Together, with your support, we are building a healthier, more equitable future for Colorado's children.
